

**Supplies from Nablus are still being held up but we have had a gift of eye drops from UAE Red Crescent which ensures we can continue treatments.**

The Raffa crossing is also partially reopened which will allow our sicker patients to find treatment outside of Gaza.

In the meantime, the Nursing School Appeal will be formally launched in March at a meeting for all registrars who have been notified of the date.

# ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST & HIS FEAST DAY, 27<sup>TH</sup> DEC

Freemasonry traditionally, at least in those parts of the world where Christians are the majority, honours two Saints John; St. John the Baptist and St. John the Evangelist, the former embodying zeal and the latter learning, both of which are virtues that we admire.

The Premier Grand Lodge was constituted in London pointedly on the Feast Day of St. John the Baptist, 24th June 1717. Its successor, the United Grand Lodge of England, was deliberately constituted on the Feast Day of St. John the Evangelist, 27<sup>th</sup> December 1813.

It has been speculated that these two feast days, occurring as they do, close to Midsummer and Midwinter, respectively, might represent to Freemasons the opposing duality of light and darkness at approximately the longest and shortest days of the year. This duality is made manifest in our mosaic pavement and in the opposing emblems of life and mortality. The concept clearly pre-existed freemasonry and has an obviously pagan origin, but its observance may have been made acceptable in a Christian context by the attribution of two important Christian Saints' Days.

The extant Knights Templar ceremony makes our celebration of the two Saints John explicitly clear, as the memory of these two saints is especially invoked when the Novice is refreshed with the Cup of Memory.

Consider how we Knights of the Temple use the Bible...St John the Evangelist is so called because he is traditionally considered the author of the Gospel of John. Its opening chapters emphasise the interconnectivity of God, "The Word" and "The Light". These are concepts fundamentally important to masons and Templars.

*"In the Beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."*

John 1:1 (KJV)

*"In him was life; and the life was the light of men."*

John 1:4 (KJV)

In the early days of the Grand Lodges, the term "St John's Mason" was widely used in place of Free and Accepted Mason. The former term still appears verbatim in the ritual of some older orders as they refer to the Craft. It is now sadly long forgotten for certain which of the two Johns, or perhaps both, were being referenced in this phrase. It is arguable, of course, that with the Mason having taken his obligation on the Gospel of St. John, the Evangelist might well be the St. John in question.

An assertion has been advanced in modern popular literature about freemasonry that St. John the Evangelist was more greatly revered by us than St. John the Baptist. This is equally uncertain and, if true, it is now equally long-forgotten, but the obligation argument might again be cited in its favour.

Some other accepted names for John the Evangelist are John the Epistle, John the Apostle, John the Theologian, John the Elder, John the Divine of Patmos and John the Presbyter, although there is no scholarly consensus on exactly how many or which of these various Johns might have been the same person. In some sense, it doesn't

really matter to freemasonry if we take them all to be one and the same person regardless, as we are applying the writings to our morals.


One does not need to research much further within masonic and Templar ceremony to find other reflections of our St. John, also called the Beloved Apostle of our Lord, or (probably; it's uncertain!) the Disciple whom Jesus Loved. Our St. John was that most beloved of the three favourite apostles of our Saviour, namely Peter, James and John. These three were the only apostles present at three important events in Christ's life; the raising of the daughter of Jairus, the Transfiguration, and the Agony in the Garden of Gethsemane. They are represented by the three Great Lights in the Knights Templar ceremony. The number three is clearly important and almost certainly has an allusion to the Holy, Blessed and Glorious Trinity (with three adjectives!).

The John that we are certainly concerned with was the son of Zebedee and St. Salome and brother to St. James the Great, one of Jesus's other disciples, James being coincidentally (or is it coincidental?!) the Patron Saint of Pilgrims. John was with Jesus from the time of his calling. He followed Christ to the High Priest's palace after his arrest, then to Golgotha, and remained there throughout the Crucifixion.



*Consider in relation to Freemasonry St. John the Evangelist's saintly attributes, the Eagle, Chalice and Scrolls (or his writings). Each has some meaning for us.*

**This same John is also traditionally thought to have authored the Book of Revelation, apocalyptic in nature, contemplating the End of Times, pertinent to wider masonry as well as Templary. Knights Templar Priests will know that their ceremony draws heavily from John's writings in the Book of Revelation.**

**In the United States, the Masonic year of many state constitutions begins on the 27<sup>th</sup> December, and their lodge officers begin their terms of office on this date. Many actually hold their meetings and special festive boards on or around this very date, unlike lodges under the English constitution nowadays.**



# REGALIA ADVICE FOR A KNIGHT-TO-BE

The KT regalia that you will need to bring on the day of your ceremony, referred to as an Installation, is as follows:

- 1) White mantle with maroon cross
- 2) White tunic with maroon cross
- 3) Maroon cap with silver cross
- 4) Brown leather belt
- 5) Black sash with a silver button/clasp
- 6) Black leather gloves with red cross, or all-black cotton gloves
- 7) Sword with scabbard (the standard one has a black handle and slim blade).
- 8) Silver breast star with red cross
- 9) Red cross breast jewel
- 10) White alms bag with red cross (this attaches to your KT belt. While this is optional, it provides easier access to cash/coins during the alms section of the Meeting, than your trouser pocket when wearing a tunic and mantle. Always keep some money in it).

If you wish to purchase new KT regalia, it's cheaper buying it as a kit rather than acquiring each item separately (though the alms bag is usually not included; you can easily find one on eBay or Amazon).

KT items will undoubtedly be even cheaper if purchased pre-owned, although finding the correct sizes and ensuring quality may pose challenges. If you prefer brand new items, it's advisable to compare different suppliers to identify a trustworthy source, such as the Province, which is now selling complete new kits.
